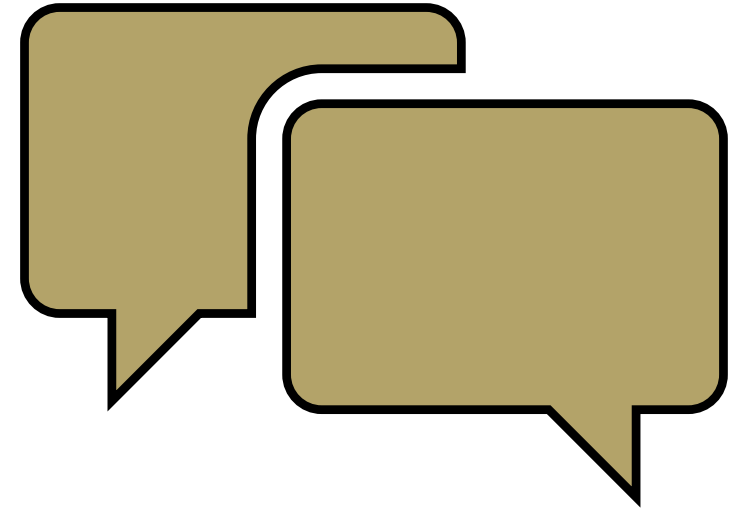

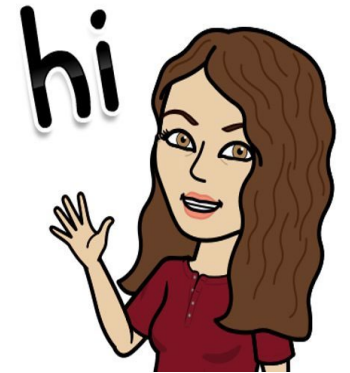

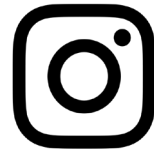

Expect Respect

EXPECT RESPECT

#1	 Eye contact Firm voice Tell them to STOP
#2	 If the person stops, move on with your day - focus on something else/find a positive friend.
#3	 If the person does not stop, decide whether to ignore them or talk to an adult.
#4	If you decide to ignore, don't look at or talk to that person. If you decide to seek support, choose an adult at school to ask for help.

Appropriate Response if Asked to Stop
STOP even if you don't think you are doing anything wrong.
Remind yourself to make a change moving forward.
Say "OK" to the request and move on with your day.

Graduation Credit Requirements

**In the respective subject areas to the right.*

- **English – 4.0 credits**
 - *Required: Literature and Composition I and II*
- **Math – 4.0 credits**
 - *Foundations of Algebra does not count for 4-year colleges/universities*
- **Science – 4.0 credits**
 - *Required: Biology; Physics (or Physical Science); Environmental Sci. or Chemistry*
- **Social Studies – 3.0 credits**
 - *World History; US History;*
 - *Economics (0.50) & Am. Gov't (0.50)*
- **Health/Personal Fitness – 1.0 credits**
 - *JROTC (3 years = exempt from H/PF requirement)*
- **CTAE Electives/Fine Arts/World Language – 3.0 credits**
 - *2.0 units of the same world language are required for 4-year colleges*
- **General Electives– 4.0 credits**



NOTE: A student has the potential to earn a total of 32.0 credits in four years because SHS is on a block schedule.

Promotion Requirements

9th Grade to 10th Grade: 5.0 Credits

- 1.0 ELA, 1.0 Math, 1.0 Science, + 2.0 additional credits

10th Grade to 11th Grade: 10.0 credits

- 2.0 ELA, 2.0 Math, 2.0 Science, + 5.0 additional credits

11th Grade to 12th Grade: 16 credits

- 2.0 ELA, 2.0 Math, 2.0 Science, + 10.0 additional credits

Obtaining a Transcript:

- **Unofficial:** Current students can see Ms. Landfair, the counseling clerk, in the lobby of the counseling office, during your lunch.
- **Official:** Current students will complete steps 1, 2, and 3:
 1. Students must **add the college(s) applying to on his/her Naviance account.**
Add these colleges to your "**Colleges I'm Applying To**" list & make sure you mark how you applied to the school.
 2. **Pay for the number of transcripts requested.**
Online via MyPaymentsPlus or bring \$2 (exact cash) to Ms. Landfair in the Counseling Office.
 3. Come to the Counseling Office to **fill out your transcript card.** This can only be done **IN-PERSON**, so you must come to the Counseling Office to complete.

NOTE: Class Rank is NOT reported by any CCSD high school.

Your HOPE GPA

It is NOT listed on your CCSD transcript.

It is based on your core (academic) course grades, including World Languages.

AP and DE courses receive .5 extra quality points.

Honors courses do not receive any additional quality points.

Middle school credits are not included in the calculation.

The HOPE Scholarship GPA calculation does not allow for any rounding.

HOPE Rigor Requirements

A student meeting the requirements to be a HOPE Scholar at the time of high school graduation must earn a minimum of four (4.0) full rigor credits prior to graduating from high school.

Credits received for academic rigor courses must be from the categories below:

- **Advanced Math**
 - Adv. Algebra, Pre-Calculus, AMDM, any AP-level Math course
- **Advanced Science**
 - Physics, Chemistry, AP Science
- **Advanced World Language**
 - Spanish 2 and higher or French 2 and higher
- **Advanced Placement (AP) or Dual Enrollment degree-level core courses**

The HOPE GPA Calculation is used for HOPE Scholarship and Zell Miller Scholarship eligibility upon graduating high school.

Georgia's HOPE & Zell Miller Scholarships

HOPE Scholarship Requirements:

- Merit based
 - 3.0 core high school GPA (as calculated by GSFC) & meet specific rigor course requirements
- Covers a percentage of college tuition
- Must maintain a 3.0 while in college to keep it
- Ability to obtain or regain HOPE if not initially qualified or lost

ZELL Miller Scholarship Requirements:

- 3.7 core high school GPA (as calculated by GSFC) & meet specific rigor course requirements
- SAT min. score of 1200 **or** ACT Composite score of 25 in one test sitting (*no super scoring*)
- Covers 100% of college tuition for Georgia public colleges
- Must maintain a 3.3 GPA while in college to keep it
- Cannot gain eligibility while in college

HOPE Grant:

- Available to Georgia residents who are working towards a certificate or diploma (continuing education programs are not eligible) at an eligible college or university in Georgia.
- No high school GPA requirement, however student must have a postsecondary cumulative 2.0 GPA, at certain checkpoints, to maintain eligibility.
- The HOPE Grant award amount will cover a *portion* of a student's tuition.

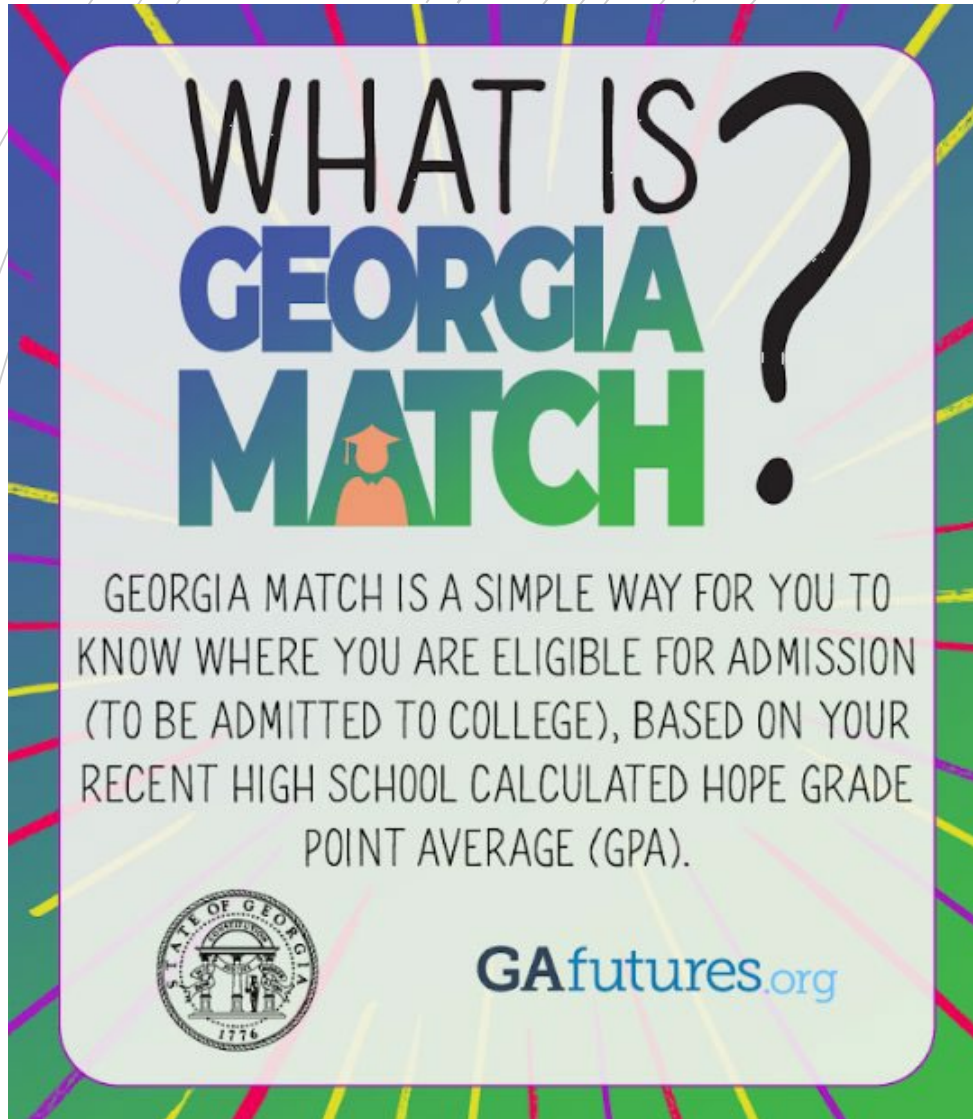
Zell Miller Grant:

- Available to Georgia residents who are working towards a certificate or diploma at a Technical College System of Georgia (TCSG) or University System of Georgia (USG) institution.
- Full-time enrollment is not required, and students are not required to graduate from high school with a specific GPA, **however**, a minimum 3.5 cumulative postsecondary GPA, at the end of each term, is required in order to maintain eligibility.
 - The first term of enrollment will be paid retroactively if the student has the required 3.5 cumulative postsecondary GPA at the end of the term.
- The Zell Miller Grant award amount is the standard undergraduate tuition rate based on the school the student attends and the number of hours enrolled.



Georgia's HOPE & Zell Miller Grants

GEORGIA MATCH



- GEORGIA MATCH is a simple way for you to know where you are eligible for admission (to be admitted to college), based on your high school calculated HOPE grade point average (GPA) through 11th grade.
- Note: GEORGIA MATCH works with public and private accredited high schools in Georgia only.

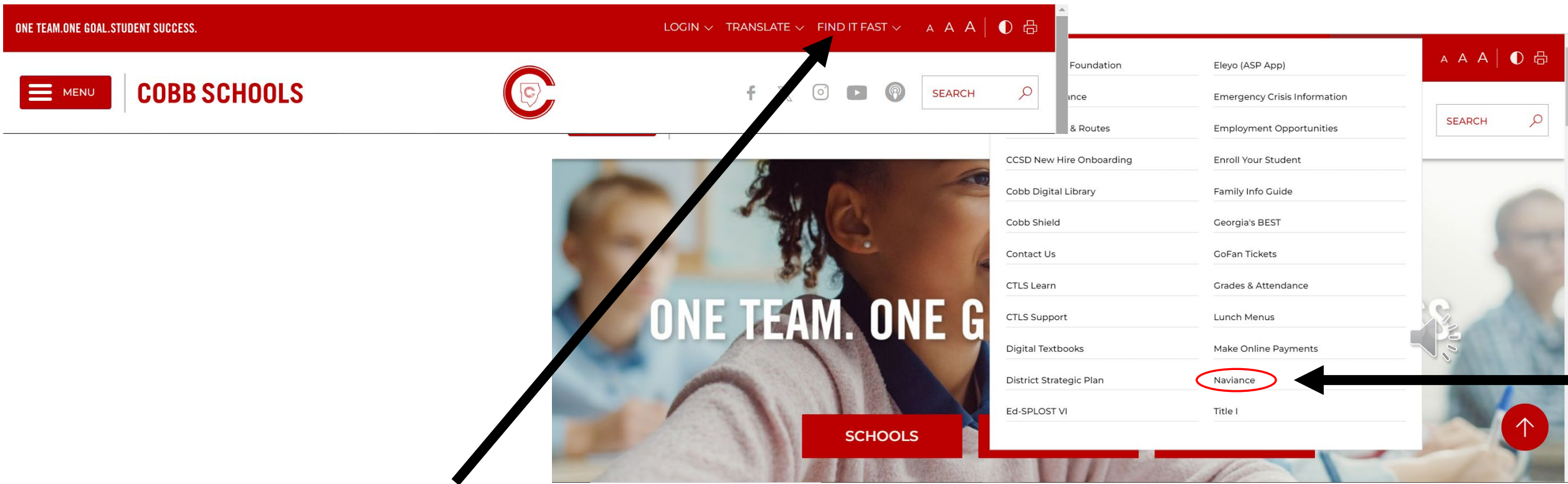

3. Go to <https://www.cobbk12.org/>
4. Click the down arrow from “**Find it Fast**” in the top red header
5. Click “**Naviance**” in the right-side column – *second link from the bottom*
6. You should be taken to your **Naviance** Student homepage automatically
 - If not automatically logged in to your account, select: (1) **Student** → (2) **Continue With Clever**

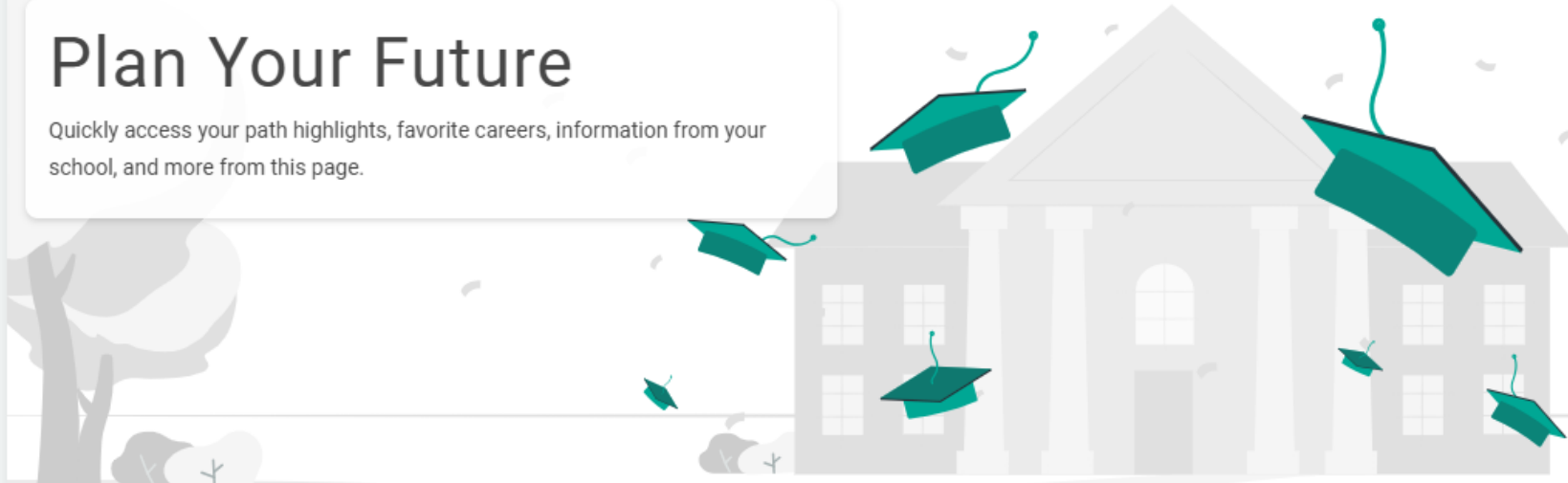

What is the Common App?



- The Common App is an undergraduate college admission application that applicants may use to apply to any of the 1,000+ member colleges and universities.
- Seniors will choose to use “Common App” or “Direct to Institution.”
 - For Common App schools, students are required to match their Common App and Naviance Student accounts.
- NOTE: Not all colleges and universities are on the Common App and have their own, individual applications that, in most cases, are web-based and can be found via the school’s undergraduate admissions website.
- **SHS Counselors only use Naviance to send college material.**

- ACT & SAT: Entrance exams for post-secondary purposes.
 - i.e. UGA, GA State, Howard, GA Southern, Savannah State, etc.

- Accuplacer: Placement exam for post-secondary purposes.
 - i.e. Chatt. Tech., Gwinnett Tech., etc.

- ASVAB:

- Check with your respective post-secondary option of choice to determine which exam you need, if any.
- Each college has different testing requirements, so you must research your college to determine what is needed of you as the applicant.

PSAT/NMSQT

(National Merit
Scholarship
Qualifying Test)

- Sprayberry High School will administer the PSAT/NMSQT (National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test) on the morning of **Tuesday, October 21, 2025**.
- 10th grade students will be automatically registered to take the assessment.
 - 9th Grade Students - may choose to participate for a \$14 fee
 - 11th Grade Students - may choose to participate for a \$13
 - 9th and 11th grade students must register by using the registration form that will be on the website and sent through CTLIS Parent
- NOTE: This year, the PSAT/NMSQT will be administered digitally. This means that students must use their CCSD issued laptop to take the assessment.

Need an Exam Fee Waiver?

If you qualify for free or reduced lunch, you are eligible for 6 total fee waivers; two (2) SAT waivers & four (4) ACT waivers.

Once you sit for the SAT or ACT, you will also qualify for college application fee waivers.

It is the responsibility of the student to submit the fee waiver directly to the college or obtain the application fee waiver from the college, whichever is applicable.

Financial Aid 101



Georgia Student Finance Application & Free App for Federal Student Aid

- The GSFAPP is a quick and secure application to apply for:
 - HOPE and Zell Miller Scholarship
 - HOPE and Zell Miller Grant
 - Georgia Tuition Equalization Grant (GTEG)- for private colleges
 - Completed once every 10 years
- For federal aid, the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (**FAFSA**) is the application you must complete.
 - This must be done on an annual basis to continue receiving federal aid.
- To apply for Georgia state aid, you can use the **FAFSA** and/or the Georgia State Financial Application (**GSFAPP**).

- Loans: Federal
- Work-study opportunities

FAFSA (Federal Application for Federal Student Aid)

- Application available at www.fafsa.gov
- Both student and parent must apply for an FSA ID
- FAFSA opens October 1, 2025. MUST complete FAFSA every year



Financial Aid Planning

1. Determine

- Determine all college cost – like books, tuition, fees, living expenses, room & board, etc.
- Use **College Scorecard** and **Federal Student Aid estimator** to see potential costs and eligible aid
- What can your family contribute?

2. Consider

- Starting at Chatt Tech to complete 30 credits
- Taking AP and/or Dual Enrollment classes in high school
- Living at home while attending college

3. Search for free \$

- Scholarships & Grants

Federal Student Aid Estimator

Our Federal Student Aid Estimator provides an estimate of how much federal student aid the student may be eligible to receive. These estimates are based on the Student Aid Index (SAI), an index number used to determine federal student aid eligibility.

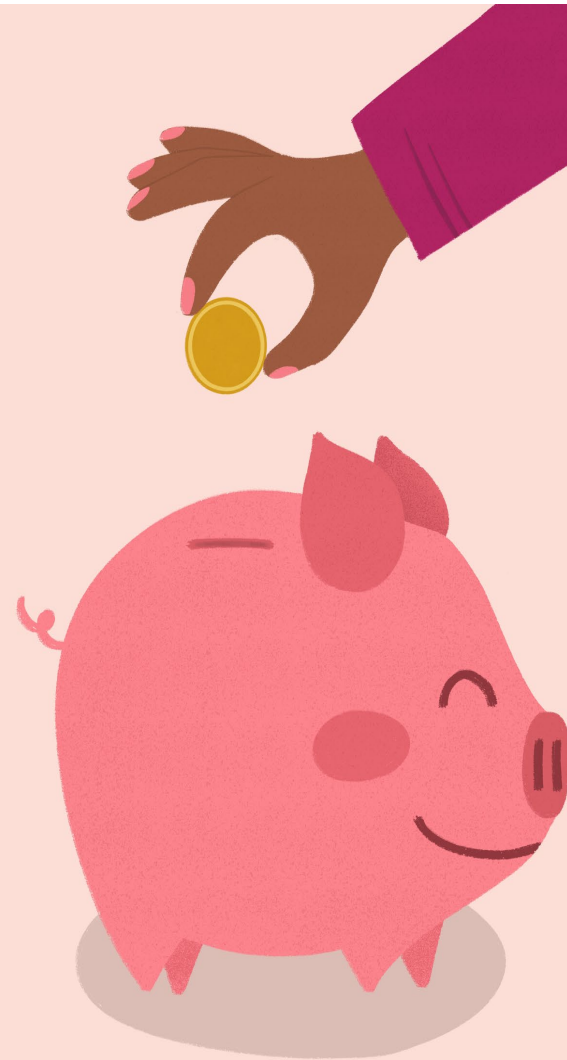
Begin Estimate of Federal Student Aid

The student may want to use the Federal Student Aid Estimator before filling out the FAFSA form to help them understand their options for paying for college or career school by providing them an early estimate of how much federal student aid they may be eligible for.

CHATT TECH

- 1 credit hour = \$107 (in-state), so 3 credits would cost \$321.00. If you take five classes (3 credits each) = 15 credits. This will cost you approximately \$1605. each semester + \$486. in fees = **\$2091.**

KSU

- 1 credit hour = \$190 (in state), so 3 credits would cost \$570, If you take 5 classes (3 credits each) = 15 credits. This will cost around \$2850, each semester + \$624. in fees = **\$3474.** If you live on-campus add another \$3,324 to \$4,869 per semester for housing, and \$2500 for 21 meals per week, per semester = **\$9298-**

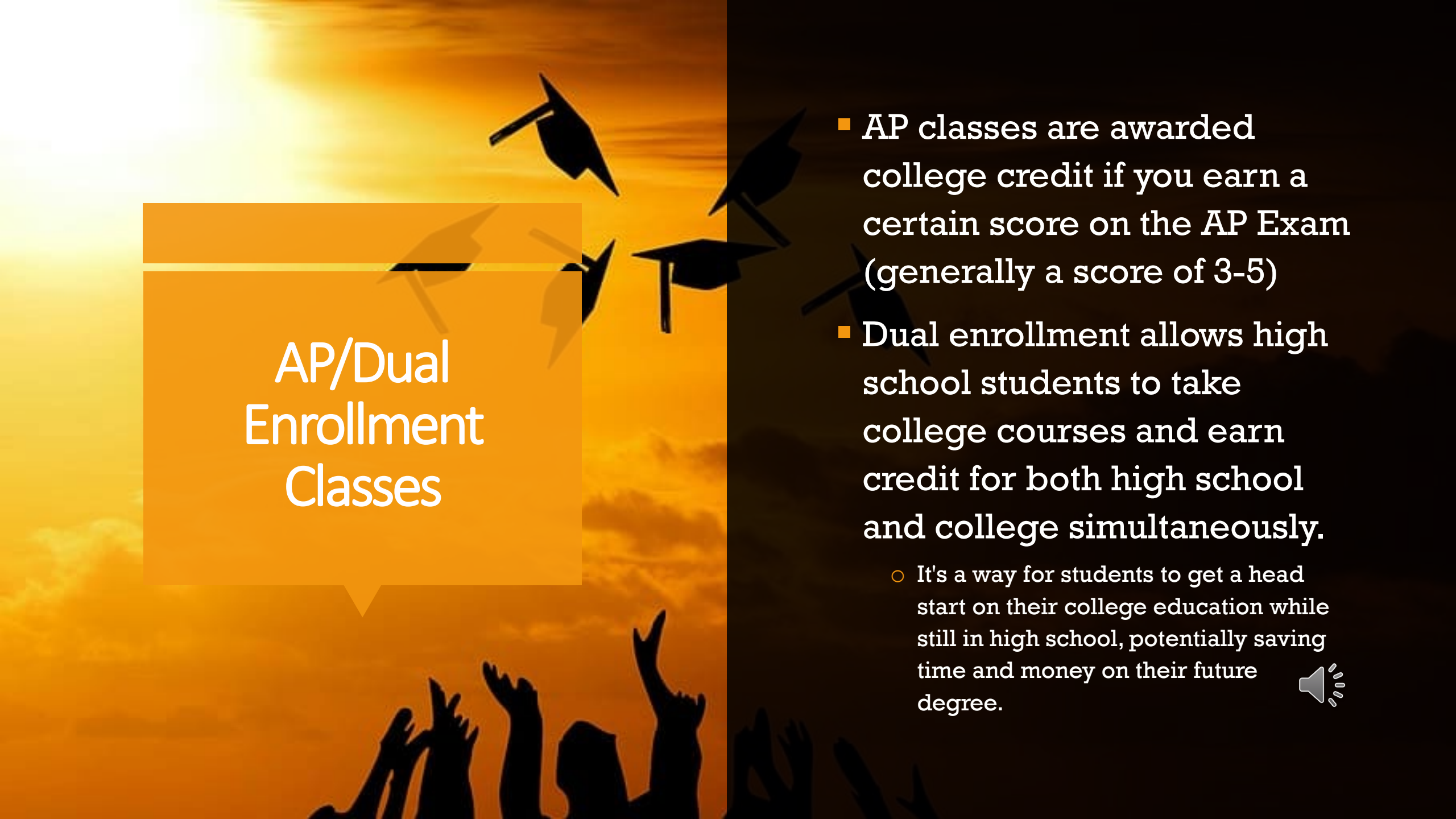


College General Education Core Requirements

- Here you will see all the classes that every freshman and sophomore will take.
- All students take ENGL 1101 & ENGL 1102. Instead of taking these classes at KSU, why not take them at Chatt Tech for a fraction of the cost? Then, when you have exhausted the transfer credits, you can apply to KSU.
- Other examples include MATH 1111, MATH 1101, HIST 1112, POLS 1101





AP/Dual Enrollment Classes

- AP classes are awarded college credit if you earn a certain score on the AP Exam (generally a score of 3-5)
- Dual enrollment allows high school students to take college courses and earn credit for both high school and college simultaneously.
 - It's a way for students to get a head start on their college education while still in high school, potentially saving time and money on their future degree.

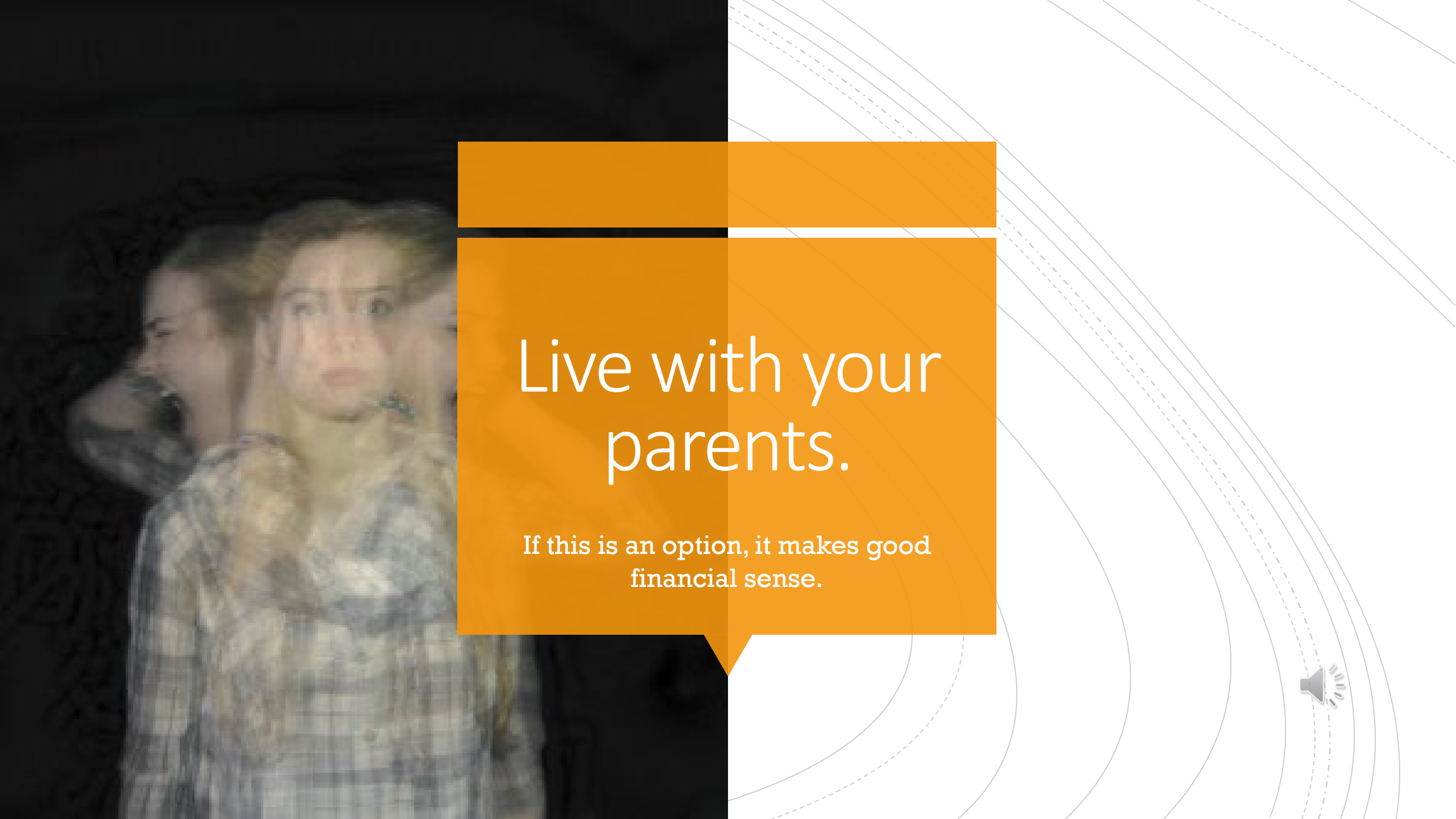
